The Student Matinee program served 3,000–6,000 Palm Beach and Martin County students, including Title 1 students who were admitted at no cost to them. This program designated the Maltz Jupiter Theatre as an approved Arts vendor with the Palm Beach County School District.

- Managed the Master Class Series and Workshop Series, which brought Broadway and South
 Florida talent to work with Conservatory students. Guests included Duncan Sheik, Nancy Carson,
 Debbi Dee, Deanna Dys, Peter Yeun, Ben Liebert, Dennis Kenney, Richard Kline, Adam
 Lendermon and more.
- Managed the Page to Stage program, a literacy-based initiative that served Palm Beach County students as well as students in Rural or Economically Disadvantaged (REDI) counties.
